Keeping Education Strong (surplus capacity):

• Primary schools have been assessed for risk against Standards, Rolls and Finance.

A small number of schools have significant concerns and are liaising with the LA about how to mitigate those risks in the above areas.

• Secondary schools are now experiencing the impact of falling rolls.

Several schools have Year 7 cohorts that are significantly smaller than previous years.

School Matters:

- Complaints processes
- Finance management and risk assessments
 - Standards in school accuracy
 - Headteacher's appraisal on agendas

- Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill:
 - QTS (Qualified Teacher Status)
 - Home schooling regulations
 - Academy orders are discretionary for RI (Requires Improvement) schools

• Academies required to teach the National Curriculum

• Managed moves for pupils - education provision for improving behaviour

• OFSTED:

 No overall grade: – graded in 4 areas (Quality of Education, Leadership & Management, Behaviour & Attitudes, Personal Development, plus: Early Years or 6th Form provision)

• Range of inspection teams and experiences in LBS since September 2024

• Encouraged to identify the GB team that will meet Ofsted and agree the narrative for the school previous areas for development, current priorities and evidence base for all
