



Republic of Ireland Teachers: Guidance for Schools

I am **fully registered** with the Irish Teaching Council (ITC) and therefore have completed my Initial Teacher Training (ITT) and probation and have Qualified Teacher Status in the Republic of Ireland.



You are exempt from doing induction in England but you must apply to have your QTS recognised in England.

Once QTS is recognised by the TA in England, they will issue you with a Teacher Reference Number (TRN) and you can then teach as a fully qualified teacher in England.

NQTs who have not completed induction in RoI are not eligible to start induction in England as they are not deemed to have gained QTS Ireland.



You will begin teaching in your school as a teacher without QTS and therefore will shadow the NQT induction process.



Your school should communicate with the Southwark NQT Induction team to register you for shadowing this induction period.

NB: a teacher would be employed as an unqualified teacher as at this point they do



not have QTS.

The teacher can provide a formal statement from the Principal/Board of the school and the Local Borough/Council to the Irish teaching Council (ITC)
