- to work strategically to identify and strengthen the response to the key Southwark educational priority areas
- in order to improve outcomes across all schools in the borough and ensuring that results are at or above London across all phases.

Objectives:

The primary focus of the partnership will be:

- On collaboration for school improvement - for all schools not just for those experiencing difficulties;
- To support schools to develop the capacity and expertise to bring about improvement through self-evaluation, improvement plans and a consistently high quality of leadership and teaching

How the aims will be achieved

The partnership board will begin each year by working from the Southwark standards report to identify key borough wide priority areas for improvement.

The board will then:

- co-ordinate and focus the school improvement activities from each relevant stakeholder
- produce an inclusive provision map for the key priority areas
- take responsibility for communicating the provision map to all schools

How the aims will be achieved

Quality Assurance and Support

In addition the board will have responsibility for quality assuring the provision map, evaluating and disseminating the impact of the provision

The Local Authority will retain its statutory duties to ensure school effectiveness, however all partners will commit to the Southwark vision and values. These include:

- contributing expertise to partner schools;
- a willingness to offer peer support;
- the sharing of best practice;
- to take responsibility for outcomes beyond their own school

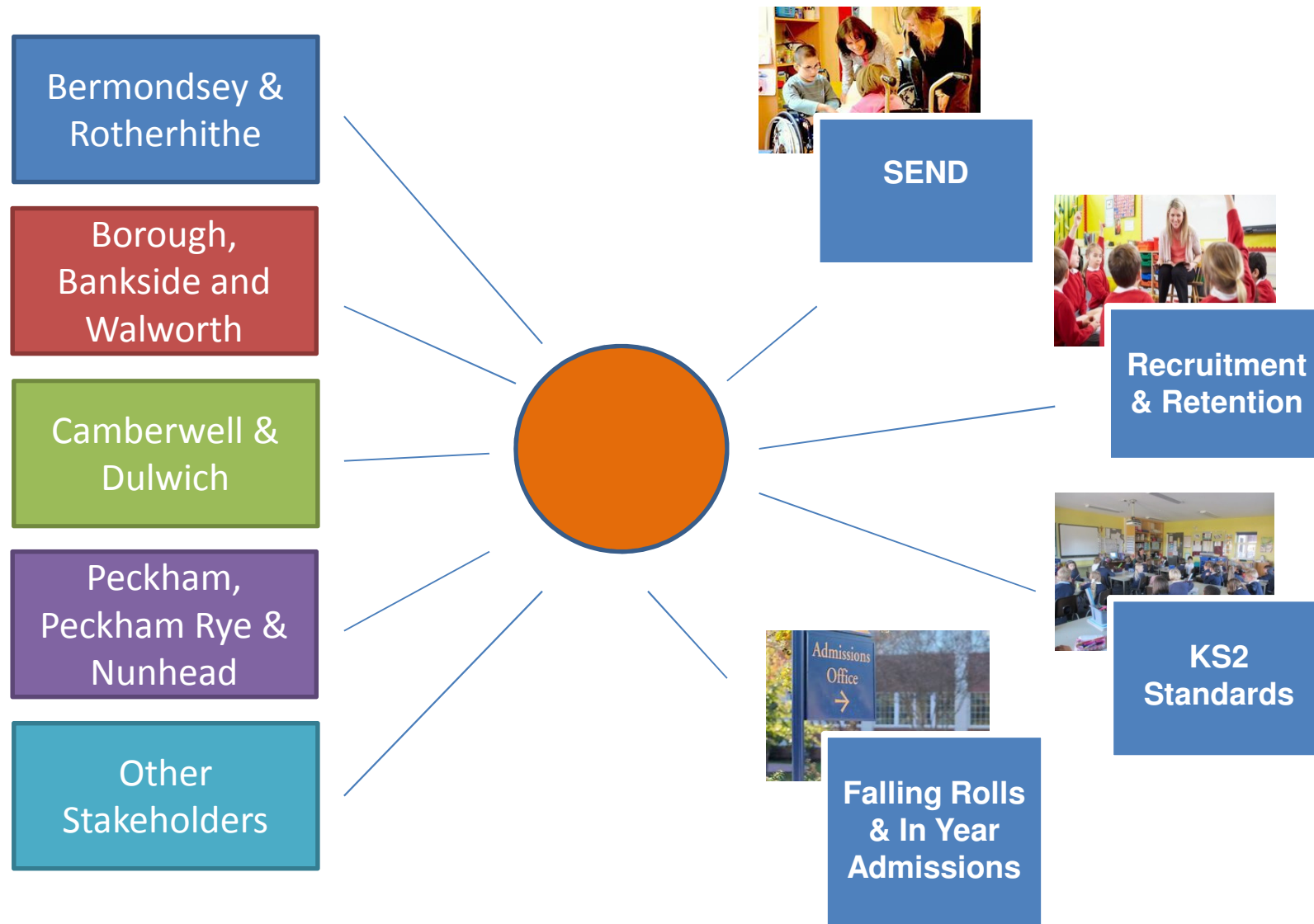

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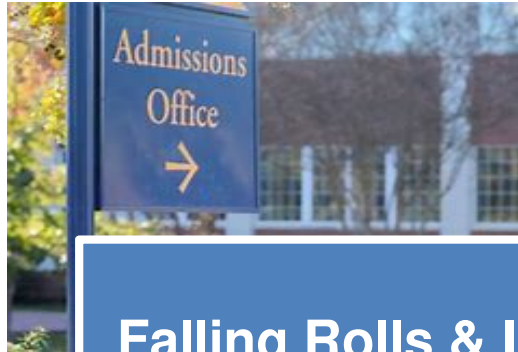
