



## Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) DfE training offer to LA's & schools in Southwark

We are being funded by the DfE to deliver 'Train the trainers' training to leads in schools, Local Authorities and MATs. In order to work strategically across areas and to reach as many RSHE leads and senior managers as possible.

In September & October we ran LIVE training for Southwark Primary & Secondary schools on:

1. 'Knowing the context of your area' for primary and secondary schools (2.5 hrs session)

This session will help schools to understand the context of RSE in terms of your local health, wellbeing, religious and ethnic data. This will support your school to understand the need for what Ofsted and the DfE require in being inclusive and sensitive to our own schools' context in RSHE. The training will equip staff to begin to comprehend the pressures and tensions faced by children and young people around RSHE.

2. Working well with your local community' for primary and secondary schools (2.5 hrs session)

This session will help staff to consider positive engagement with parents and a school's local community around issues of RSE. The session will consider how faith/pupil-sensitive RSE fits into the government and OFSTED requirements for schools. Giving case studies and proven techniques to engage with your school community.
