



Implementation

Our statutory duty



Local Authorities (LAs) have a duty to promote and act as champions of high standards in education across their schools. Each LA interprets their duties differently and has considerable freedom as to how they deliver their statutory responsibilities. In Southwark, we term our duty for school performance as the universal provision which is interpreted to reflect the Southwark context.

The Southwark Education, Learning and Achievement-Local Authority universal provision offer is regularly shared with all schools for comment and can be found on the schools website;


