What is **Prevention?**

Depaul UK's London Youth Homeless Prevention Service is a holistic approach to homeless prevention. We offer tailored support to help young people between the ages of 11 - 25 navigate the challenges and risks of homelessness.

A young person will be able to access multiple services which provide the relevant support.

We deliver bold and relatable workshops to whole year groups, using digital media and creative techniques to build their knowledge of youth homelessness and related issues.

We also deliver training that enables professionals to play a vital role in preventing youth homelessness by equipping them to recognise and respond to early indicators and associated risks.



Targeted Intervention Workshops

We recognise that some young people are more vulnerable and at increased risk of family relationship breakdown and youth homelessness. In response, we offer a series of linked targeted intervention workshops aimed at smaller groups of students and work in collaboration with school/college staff to identify students most at risk.

Focussing on:

- emotional literacy and mental wellbeing
- positive and healthy relationships
- managing conflict
- making safer choices

Positive and healthy relationships, and how to judge when a relationship is unsafe

- Reconnect will use a young person-focused approach to improve communication, mutual understanding and respect between young people and their families, thereby strengthening relationships.
- When accessing Reconnect, young people and family members will receive support from an accredited Mediator.
- They will offer several individual and joint sessions to explore issues from each party's point of view.
