

1. Introduction

SACREs have responsibility for advising a Local Authority (LA) on religious education and collective worship in its schools. The main purpose of the annual report is to hold the LA to account, by informing the Secretary of State and key partners what advice SACRE gave the LA during the year and how that was responded to; this includes advice on RE and Collective Worship in those schools for which the LA has responsibility. The reporting period for this report is 1st September 2018 – 31st August 2019.

2. Meetings

In the academic year 2018-2019 Southwark SACRE meetings were arranged on the following occasions:

3. Advice to Statutory Bodies

3.1 Local Authority

Southwark SACRE advised the Council that the Current Agreed Syllabus needed to be renewed and requested a budget for this process to begin.

The Southwark school's website was revamped during the year and the Council link member, Mr Lee Souter was asked to put SACRE documents onto the new website at <u>www.schools.southwark.gov.uk</u>.

SACRE decided to run a competition for schools and give an award for excellent religious education. They requested that this award could be part of the Southwark school's awards for excellence evening. This was declined because the evening had a very full programme. The competition was run and the Chair and RE consultant went to the winning school to present the award. The previous Council link member went to the Head Teachers breakfast meetings and spoke about SACRE and the competition.

3.2 Schools

Throughout the year advice is given by telephone and email to teachers and head teachers who request this. Several requests for the Southwark Agreed syllabus units of work were made.

At the beginning of each term a news sheet is sent out to the Coordinators with information on the RE meetings and any other bits of news and information that will be useful to them. Three RE network meetings were held at the Council Offices and these included discussions on ways to teach about God, various Festival ideas, the Understanding Christianity project and sharing information on useful websites for schools to use.

A questionnaire to teachers to ascertain how the current syllabus is being used and what teachers would like to see in a new syllabus was sent out in September 2016 and much time was taken up during the year discussing what the teachers would like to see in a new Syllabus.

The RE Consultant informed teachers of a website <u>www.reconsultant.co.uk</u> which has information for Southwark teachers on it as well as the Southwark schools website. The Award for Excellent RE was launched at the January meeting with the theme of 'What is Peace?' The award was won by Dulwich Wood Primary school who sent in various pieces of poetry and prose and put on a special collective worship for the Chair and RE Consultant. They received a prize of a certificate, some Jewish artefacts and a book on using artefacts to enhance RE lessons.

The school website checking, which started in Autumn 2015 continued during the year and is a useful way to monitor the level of RE in schools.

3.3 Government

SACRE discussed the RE Commission and were encouraged to write in with evidence

4. Provision for and standards in Religious Education

4.1 Locally Agreed Syllabus

At the Summer meeting SACRE had two presentations, from Newham and RE Today Services, regarding their syllabus. The committee discussed the presentations and what was on offer and decided to allow the teachers to choose which they liked at the Autumn RE coordinators meeting. (The teachers chose the Newham Syllabus, and this will be worked on and reported in the next Annual Report)

No formal complaints about religious education were received this year.

4.2 Standards in Religious Education:

With the increased number of Academies, it is difficult to ascertain the level of specialist RE teachers in Southwark schools and monitoring of the quality of religious education. Monitoring of quality and standards of education has been done through the RE Coordinators at the network meetings. Monitoring is also done through the websites of schools with each member of SACRE taking 4 or 5 schools to look at.

4.3 Exam data

Eleven schools entered pupils into the full course GCSE and nine of these entered the majority of the cohort. 68.4% of entrants in Southwark were awarded grades 9-5, 80.8% were awarded grades 9-4.

5. Collective worship

A guidance document on making Collective Worship interesting and relevant is on the Southwark Schools website along with a list of trained speakers. Some schools use outside agencies, particularly Spinnaker, to provide some of their worship requirements. The SACRE's Determinations procedure is available on request. There have been no applications for a determination this year. There have also been no complaints concerning Collective Worship referred to SACRE during this academic year.

6. Other work of Southwark SACRE

At the Autumn meeting there was a presentation from the Prevent officer for Southwark. The Vice Chair obtained a document which listed the Faith Communities of Southwark. The committee discussed and approved the NASACRE constitution changes. The Chair went to the NASACRE annual general meeting in York and reported to the committee. She was also able to talk to the committee about three schools in Southwark that she had visited. The Vice Chair volunteered to find out more about the Southwark Interfaith group so that we can fill some vacancies on SACRE and see if we can link with them in other ways. The SACRE action plans were discussed at each meeting and updated as appropriate. The updated Collective Worship guidance was produced and put onto the website. Some discussions were held regarding a document on Respecting pupils of Faith in Schools which will be produced next year.

Assistance was given to the Buddhist representative regarding a Buddhist Society training day for teachers.

7. Management of SACRE

The Council pay for upto 12 days for an RE Consultant to attend meetings and give advice to schools and run a network once per term. There is a representative from the Council's Education Department at every meeting and a clerk to SACRE and refreshments are also provided. The meetings have been held in the Council offices this year, there is not a budget for any other activities.

Meetings have been quorate this year, and two new teacher members have been attending. We are still looking for a Hindu and a Sikh representative.

Southwark SACRE does not have an opportunity to contribute to other agendas within the Council.

The RE Consultant attends the Southwark Cathedral Education management committee meetings and is a member of the Diocesan Board of Education.
